What is the relationship between Israel and the Church

God designated Israel to be "My own possession among all the peoples... and to be ... a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (Exodus 19:5-6) Israel's display of holiness was to attract the surrounding nations (cf. 1 Kings 10:9). Israel, however, did not remain faithful. God has not "rejected his people... [He] has not rejected his people whom he foreknew" (Romans 11:1-2). They have stumbled but not "in order that they might fall... Rather through their trespass salvation has come to the Gentiles so as to make Israel jealous." (Romans 11:11) Scripture is not confusing, "if their [Israel's] transgression is riches for the world and their failure is riches for the Gentiles [non-Jews], how much more will their fulfillment be!" (Romans 11:12). The "riches for the Gentiles" and "for the world" have come in the form of a spiritual organism called the Church.

The Kingdom Among You: Luke 17:21

Jesus stood before the Pharisees as King and said, "the kingdom will suddenly be in your midst." The gospels repeatedly declare the kingdom is "near" (Matt. 4:17; 10:7) and even on two occasions, "has come upon you" (Matt. 12:28; Luke 11:20). The kingdom was so near that only a lack of repentance and submission to the King stood in the way of the Mediatorial Kingdom being established in Israel. The failure of Israel to repent resulted in a change of relationship temporarily away from Israel to the Gentiles.
